This is My Scary Robot Voice

for string quartet 2015

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Program Note

In *This is My Scary Robot Voice*, players "incant" the rhythms of a number of different sentences, as though speaking them aloud. These sentences are all personal mantras – things I tell myself as a small, soft-spoken woman, especially when I'm in a crowd or a group of strangers where often I tend to be very reserved. To overcome my shyness, I force myself to imagine that my voice is very loud and that I am very tall, so that everyone in the room can't help but hear me and see me. This does help me stand taller and speak louder, but sometimes the results are rather unnatural-sounding; hence the "scary robot voice" that competes throughout this movement with the more pleasant sounds.

Performance Notes

Scordatura: Violin II string IV = F#3, Cello string IV = B1


Incantation: Play each set of notes with the rhythm and emphasis of the associated sentence(s). Rhythm and inflection can be varied somewhat as the sentences repeat, just as you would do while speaking the same sentence over and over again. ("This is my normal voice. *This* is my normal voice. *This* is my normal voice..." etc.) In some instances, the articulation has been explicitly written (*legato, spiccato,* accent marks, bowings etc.) next to or above the text. These specific articulations should continue as long as that specific sentence is repeated.


Time: Horizontal space is roughly representative of time; more specific timespans are marked at the bottom of each page, between dashed lines. The dashed lines represent timepoints where at least one player (and usually more) begins a new pattern. Where a timepoint is marked "tutti" all players should not only coordinate the beginnings of their new patterns, but should also play in rhythmic unison, diverging gradually. Within timespans, individual musical events are usually not at specified times, but can be timed at each player's discretion based on the location of the events on the page. Note that the length of time represented on each page varies somewhat; most pages are around 1 minute in length, but some are shorter or longer (45 seconds to 1:20 or so).

Staves and pitches: Most pitches are played in the context of incanting the text; however, sometimes the direction "sustain" is given, which indicates a long sustained sound with bowing as imperceptible as possible.

Microtones are typically approximations of partials above a fundamental that may or may not be sounding.

In some cases, the player may be asked to play multiple pitches as they incant the sentence, or may have the option to alternate pitches.







